The event fees below allow each participant to make and fire one piece from their two-hour event. Additional pieces are \$10 each. Our staff will provide the finishing touches with the glaze of your choice. Finished work will be ready for pick-up approximately 3 weeks after the event.

While clay materials are washable, we recommend that participants dress for mess. Groups are welcome to bring food or beverages. Book 5 or more private events or individual lessons for a 10% discount.
